Chicken and Bean Burritos

From: Campbell's Kitchen Prep: 10 minutes Cook: 10 minutes

Serves: 4

These quick and tasty burritos feature a zesty combination of chicken, bean soup and salsa inside a warmed flour tortilla and are ready to serve in about 20 minutes.

Ingredients:

tablespoon vegetable oil
 medium onion, chopped (about 1/2 cup)
 teaspoon garlic powder
 can (11 1/2 ounces) Campbell's
 Condensed
 Bean with Bacon Soup
 3/4 cup Pace

2 cans (4.5 ounces **each**) Swanson® Premium White Chunk Chicken Breast in Water, drained 8 flour tortillas (8-inch), warmed

Directions:

Heat the oil in a 10-inch skillet over medium heat. Add the onion and garlic powder and cook until the onion is tender.

Stir the soup, salsa and chicken in the skillet. Cook until the chicken mixture is hot and bubbling.

Spoon **about 1/3 cup** chicken mixture down the center of **each** tortilla. Fold up the sides of the tortillas around the filling then fold up the ends to enclose the filling.
