
#### CORVETTE RACING AT ROAD AMERICA: No. 3 Corvette Retains Points Lead

On October 7 Corvette Racing capped its championship-winning season with a runner-up finish at Road Atlanta's Petit Le Mans for Antonio Garcia, Jan Magnussen and Mike Rockenfeller in the No. 3Corvette C7.R. It put a Bowtie on a day that saw Corvette Racing and Chevrolet sweep the GT Le Mans (GTLM) Manufacturer, Driver and Team titles in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship.

The No. 4 Corvette C7.R of Oliver Gavin, Tommy Milner and Marcel Fässler placed fourth in a late-race comeback
