Corvette News:

With the new 2019 Corvette ZR1, Chevy builds the best 'Vette yet –

This is what you want to know: 755 horsepower, 715 lb.-ft. of torque, top speed of over 210 mph, according to General Motors.

What's more, you don't need to know how to use a clutch pedal to drive the 2019 Chevrolet Corvette ZR1. For the first time ever, the ZR1 will be available with an automatic transmission.

As the fourth ZR1 in Corvette history, the 2019 version is equipped with a direct- and port-injected, supercharged, 6.2-liter V8 engine, appropriately named the LT5. The supercharger is 52% larger in terms of displacement than the one used for the Corvette Z06, which itself is no slouch in the performance department. In fact, the car's new carbon fiber hood is open in the middle in order to clear the hardware.
