This 1965 Corvette coupe which sold at the 2018 Barrett Jackson Scottsdale auction was created by GM as a demonstration exhibit. In addition to the body/interior raising from the chassis the transmission, bell housing and engine all feature cut-aways:

It's not a Corvette but:

Number 59 of the 69 COPO 9560 high-performance 1969 Camaros built. Finished in Hugger Orange with black interior, this COPO 9560 high-performance Camaro is powered by an all-aluminum 427ci engine with 12.0 compression and open-chamber cylinder heads. It is the only ZL1 ordered with an NC8 chambered exhaust. Extremely rare in a COPO, it features 9560 M22 Rock Crusher 4-speed manual transmission.

It sold for \$770,000 at the Barrett Jackson Scottsdale auctions!

Corvette Racing: 2018 Rolex 24 hr, Corvettes finish 3rd and 4th!

Despite having the pole position the C7R Corvettes were no match for the speed of the Ford GT's.

At the end of the 24 hour race the Corvettes were 2 and 3 laps behind the 1st and 2nd place Fords.

Watching the in-car videos periodically throughout the race made it apparent that the Corvettes were not able to carry the speed of the competitors (including the Porsche RSR's and Ferrari 488's). They need the mid-engine car to maintain their competitiveness.

The Corvettes seemed to be able to brake later but lost ground quickly on exiting the turns in spite of the larger V8 power compared to the smaller turbo engines.
