The last C7-generation Corvette, a manual Z06, was just auctioned off at Barrett-Jackson's Northeast Auction at Mohegan Sun Casino for \$2.7 million, all of which will go to charity..

Finally, the C-8 Corvette is here:

On July 18th at the former El Toro Marine Air Station blimp hanger GM introduced the new 2020 C-8 Corvette. 495 h.p. and base price under \$60,000. For those worried about luggage space, they report it can hold the same 5 piece luggage set as the C-7 (in spite of having 2.5 cu ft less space, 13 vs. 15.7) at least until the electric motors of the hybrid take the "frunk" space.

While I don't like the 4 square exhaust tips at the lower corner rather than dual "cannons" through the rear valance the later is not possible due to the rear 2 golf bag sized luggage area.

By July 28th GM was reporting that the first year's production is nearly sold out!
