CORVETTE RACING Going Back to LeMans:

After having to withdraw from last year's race due to the COVID-19 pandemic that wreaked havoc on motorsport events worldwide, the racing variant of the Chevrolet Corvette C8 will finally get a chance to compete at the Circuit de la Sarthe this summer during the 2021 24 Hours of Le Mans, currently scheduled for Aug. 21-22.

Per the entry list, the No. 63 Corvette C8.R will be driven by American Jordan Taylor, Spanish racing driver Antonio Garcia, and New Zealander Nicky Catsburg. Meanwhile, the No. 64 machine will have American Tommy Milner and British racing drivers Nicholas Tandy and Alexander Sims behind the wheel.

From the Kitchen:

Carrot Loaf Cake with Tangy Lemon Glaze

Ingredients

For the cake:

- 3/4 cup/180 milliliters neutral oil or mild olive oil, plus more for greasing the pan
- 1 cup/225 grams packed light brown sugar

2 large eggs

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon ground cardamom

1 teaspoon kosher salt

 $1\ 3/4\ cups/225\ grams$ all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon baking soda



1 1/2 packed cups peeled and grated carrots (about 6 ounces/165 grams, from 3 medium carrots, add nuts, Raisins, pineapple, ginger to change it up)

For the glaze:

1 lemon

1 cup/100 grams powdered sugar

1 tablespoon finely grated carrot (optional)

Directions

1. Make the cake: Heat the oven to 350 degrees and set a rack in the center. Oil a 9-by-5-inch loaf pan and line it with a strip of parchment paper that hangs over the two long sides. Oil the paper, too.

2. Add the light brown sugar and eggs to a large bowl and whisk vigorously until pale in color, about 2 minutes. Add the oil, cinnamon, cardamom and salt. Whisk until well combined and smooth.

3. Add the flour, baking powder and baking soda, and whisk, starting slowly to incorporate the flour without spilling it, until well combined and smooth, switching to a rubber spatula if necessary. Fold in the grated carrots. The batter will be very thick.

4. Scrape the batter into the prepared pan and smooth the top. Tap the pan on the counter a few times to remove any big air bubbles.

5. Bake the cake until golden and puffed and a tester inserted into the center comes out clean, 50 to 60 minutes. Set the pan on a rack to cool for 10 minutes. After 10 minutes, use the parchment paper to lift the cake out of the pan and set on the rack over a baking sheet to cool completely.

6. When the cake is cool, make the glaze: Finely zest the lemon into a medium bowl. Juice the lemon, and set aside lemon juice. Add the powdered sugar and finely grated carrot (if using) to the bowl with the zest, along with 4 teaspoons of the lemon juice. Whisk vigorously until smooth. Add more lemon juice as needed to make a thick but pourable glaze. Pour the glaze over the cooled cake and let it set for a few minutes before slicing. Store the cake well wrapped at room temperature for 3 to 4 days.
